## **Government Degree College Diggal : An Overview**

This College was notified by the State Government vide notification No. EDN-A-KHA (1)-1/2014 in January 2014 to promote and uplift the standard of Higher Education in the remote and rural pocket of district Solan. The institution became functional in June 2014 and imparts UG level education in eight subjects in Arts (Humanities) stream. The college was further academically enriched in June 2015 with the addition of Commerce Stream. Nurtured in the lap of lower Shivalik Hills, the College has a picturesque location, salubrious climate and a sound academic ambience.

### **राजकीय महाविद्यालय दिग्गल: एक अवलोकन**

जिला सोलन के दूरस्थ एवं ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में उच्चतर शिक्षा के स्तर में सुधार एवं उत्थान हेतु राज्य सरकार की अधिसूचना क्रम संख्या EDN-A-KHA(1)-1/2014 के अंतर्गत जनवरी 2014 में राजकीय महाविद्यालय दिग्गल का आरंभ किया गया। जून 2014 में यह संस्थान व्यवहारिक रूप में आया तथा यहाँ स्नातक स्तर पर शिक्षा प्रदान करने हेतु मानविकी वर्ग में आठ विषयों की कक्षाएँ कार्यान्वित हैं। जून 2015 में वाणिज्य विषय जुड़ जाने से महाविद्यालय शैक्षणिक रूप से समृद्ध हुआ। यह महाविद्यालय शिवालिक की निचली पहाड़ियों में स्थित है तथा यहाँ का शैक्षणिक माहौल अति सुरम्य एवं स्वास्थ्यप्रद है।

### **ADMISSION DETAILS: Courses offered in the College:**

The College offers UG ( B.A.) Course in Eight Subjects in the Faculty of Arts (Humanities) and UG (B.Com) course in the stream of Commerce, as per the CBCS-UGC(RUSA). From the academic session 2016-17 the Himachal Pradesh University has adopted this new pattern of education for higher studies i.e., CBCS-UGC (RUSA). This pattern of education was in the academic session 2017-18 and was adhered in the academic session 2018-19. From the academic session 2018–19 onward, the CBCS-UGC (RUSA) pattern was restructured into an annual system in terms of both its design and format. This Annual Pattern will be followed in the session 2026-27 for only 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year classes. **However Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, from the Academic Session 2026-27 is implementing New Education Policy(NEP 2020) in which the semester system is going to be introduce in 1<sup>st</sup> Year.**

महाविद्यालय में स्नातक स्तर पर CBCS(UGC) के अंतर्गत पारित पाठ्यक्रम में, कला संकाय(मानविकी) में आठ विषय तथा वाणिज्य स्नातक(B.Com.) वाणिज्य संकाय में प्रस्तावित किए गए हैं। शिक्षा का यह नया स्वरूप CBCS(RUSA) अकादमिक स्तर 2016-17 में हिमाचल प्रदेश विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा अपनाया गया तथा 2017-18 और आगे भी इसी स्वरूप का अनुसरण किया गया। नई वार्षिक प्रणाली अकादमिक सत्र 2018-19 से आरंभ हुई तथा 2026-27 में द्वितीय एवं तृतीय वर्ष के लिए भी यही प्रणाली लागू रहेगी। **यद्यपि Himachal Pradesh University, शिमला द्वारा शैक्षणिक सत्र 2026–27 से राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति 2020 लागू की जा रही है, जिसके अंतर्गत प्रथम वर्ष में सेमेस्टर प्रणाली प्रारंभ की जाएगी।**

### **NEW EDUCATION POLICY 2020**

**The New Pattern of NEP Semester Pattern: Implemented w.e.f. the Academic Session 2026-27 (For BA/BCom 1<sup>st</sup> year)**

## **CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES**

### **1. Introduction**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recognises that higher education plays a crucial role in promoting human and societal well-being, and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution—a democratic, just, socially conscious, and humane nation that upholds liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. The NEP 2020 notes, “given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals.”

The NEP 2020 states, “Assessments of educational approaches in undergraduate education that integrate the humanities and arts with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) have consistently shown positive learning outcomes, including increased creativity and innovation, crucial thinking and higher-order thinking capacities, problem-solving abilities, teamwork, communication skills, more in-depth learning and mastery of curricula across fields, increases in social and moral awareness, etc., besides general engagement and enjoyment of learning.”

Further, the NEP 2020 also recommends that “the undergraduate degree will be of either 3- or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications.”

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (UGC-CCFUGP 2022)” incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options, which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Based on the UGC-CCFUGP notified in December 2022, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla (HPU) has developed a Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (HPU-CCFUGP, hereafter HPU-UGP), incorporating all essential aspects of the UGC-CCFUGP to facilitate the achievement of the policy visions stated in the NEP 2020. This HPU-UGP will also apply to the professional courses not covered by other regulatory bodies.

## UG Degree Programmes

The UGC-CCFUGP: 3.2.3 offers various undergraduate degree programmes for students to choose from. The different UG Degree programmes are:

i. **UG Degree Programmes with Single Major:** A student must secure a minimum of 50% credits in the major discipline for a 3-year/4-year UG Degree to be awarded a single major.

**For example:**

In a 3-year UG programme, the total number of credits **to be earned is 128**; a student of History with 64 credits will be awarded a Bachelor of Arts in History with a single major.

Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, the total number of credits **to be earned is 168**; a student of History with a minimum of 84 credits will be awarded a Bachelor of Arts (Honours or Honours with Research) in History with a single Major.

iii. **Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes:** The credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects to achieve core competence in the multidisciplinary programme.

**For example:**

A student opts for (a) Mathematics, (b) Economics and (c) Political Science for a UG programme. The degree for such students will be a Bachelor of Arts, awarded after a 3-year undergraduate programme. For such a candidate, to pursue a degree in the fourth year, they shall have to choose only one of the disciplines (A, B or C) in which they have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years. The degree will be awarded a Bachelor of Arts (Honours or Honours with Research) in Mathematics (if chosen Mathematics) for a 4-year undergraduate programme.

iv. **Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes:** For students pursuing a multidisciplinary programme of study, the credits for core courses will be distributed across various broad disciplines, including Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, Data Analysis, Social Sciences, and Humanities.

**For example:**

A student who opts for a UG programme in Arts will have the total credits to core courses distributed across (a) History (b) Hindi and (c) Sociology disciplines. The Degree will be awarded as a Bachelor's in Arts for a 3-year UG programme. For such a candidate, to pursue a Degree in the fourth year, he/she shall have to choose only one of the disciplines (either A, B or C) in which he/she has studied at least 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs of Core/Major courses in the first three years. The degree awarded will be Bachelor of Arts (Honours/ or Honours with Research) in History (if chosen History) for a 4-year UG Programme.

### Eligibility for the UG Programmes

a. A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognised institution (UGC-CCFUGP: 3.2.3).

b. Admission to the 3-year/4-year UG programme will be based on the preference of the Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any major in the 3-year programmes/they will be admitted based on their preferences for subject combinations.

c. Admission to a discipline-specific course or major will be subject to the availability of the subject and the capacity of the college/department/centre.

d. No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline unless She/He fulfils the prerequisites of courses as fixed by the university.

**Reservation**

The statutory reservation policy of the Government of Himachal Pradesh shall be followed in the selection of eligible candidates for admission.

### Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The HPU-UGP is directly connected to the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in HPU-UGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such, a student under HPU-UGP must register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

### Duration for Award of UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Degree

The UG Programmes will be of either 3 or 4-year duration with appropriate certifications and exits, such as:

- i. UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study with 44 credits, including four credits in I/AP/CI or work-based vocational course(s) offered during winter/or summer term.
  - ii. UG Diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study with 86 credits.
  - iii. 3-Year Bachelor's Degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) with 128 credits.
  - iv. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with 168 credits.
  - v. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with a Research Project or Dissertation under the guidance of an eligible regular faculty member, securing 168 credits, out of which 12 credits will be for the Research Project or Dissertation.
  - vi. Students will be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study, but the total duration of completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.
- It should be noted that any certificate/diploma/degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e., passes) all the required courses (papers) up to that point in time.

*Note: College/CDOE/Department/HPU-DES will decide whether to offer a 3-year or 4-year undergraduate programme before the academic session starts. However, the 4-Year Bachelor's Degree Programme may be considered a preferred option, as it would provide an opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education(vide UGS letter no 27-3/2023(CU)dated 28<sup>th</sup> March, 2023).*

### Change of Programme

The students who wish to change programmes in the 2nd year (or third semester) shall be eligible only for the 3-year B.A. programme (Multidisciplinary), subject to availability of seats and the Major programme in the College and earning of additional credits (8 each in each of the two core Major disciplines). Two courses of any one discipline studied in the first two semesters will be treated as a Minor. The remaining 16 credits shall be earned from a single Minor discipline.

- ❖ **Students who secure 75% or more marks in the first three years shall be eligible for a 4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research).**
- ❖ H P University 8 Migration Students pursuing their 3-year Undergraduate programme through the regular mode (i.e., a student from any college affiliated with H.P. University) can transfer their admission to CDOE at any point during a semester. Such a student, however, shall have to pay the complete Semester fee of the concerned semester as well, irrespective of the duration of the semester gone by. Students pursuing their 3-year Undergraduate programme from CDOE can be migrated or admitted as regular students to colleges against vacant seats at the beginning of the semesters.
- ❖ **Inter-Institution Mobility** The HPU-UGP enables students to engage in inter-institutional mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, HPU will take into account the credits that the student has in their ABC. For an incoming student, the following should be observed: a. b. c. 16. The entry is subject to the availability of seats in the concerned discipline. The student must fulfil all the academic prerequisites of the relevant discipline. HPU will award a degree to a student only when the student has completed at least 60% of the credits for core courses offered by HPU.

## Programme Structure

Semester A semester comprises 90 working days, and the academic calendar is divided into two semesters. Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes H P University 9 Winter and Summer terms will be notified separately with a vacation schedule. I/A/P/C/or work-based vocational education, field-based learning, and training will be carried out during the winter and summer terms. Regular courses may also be offered during the winter or summer terms in a fast-track mode, enabling students to complete additional coursework and reduce backlogs. Arrangements may be made for courses to be offered in the winter/or summer terms, depending on the availability of faculty and the number of students.

## Credit Requirements

The minimum credit requirements of each category of courses for 3-Year and 4-Year Bachelor's Programmes (Honours or Honours with Research) are given in Table 1

### Important Instruction

- The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
- In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
- At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
- Additional Seats:** The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
- The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
- A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
- MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.
- AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
- A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
- I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
- To pursue an Honour degree in the 4th year, students will have to choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
- A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.

13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
14. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline
16. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

*\*As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications. Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year will be retrospectively applicable.*

### Annual System for BA/B.Com 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year

#### CBCS – UGC (RUSA) Annual Pattern: Implemented w.e.f. the Academic Session 2018-2019 (For BA/B.Com 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3 year)

The Annual Pattern of CBCS-UGC (RUSA) was adopted for the UG Classes w.e.f. the Academic Session 2018-19 vide directions issued from the o/o the Secretary of Higher Education (HP) on dated 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2018 which were further duly endorsed from the Office of Registrar (Academic Branch) HP University, Shimla vide letter No.-7-1/2004-HPU(Acad) on dated 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. In course of executing this change of pattern (from Semester to Annual System) the following parameters came into force for the Annual System:

- The minimum passing marks will be 40% in Aggregate. However, 35% each in Internal Assessment and Final Examinations will be compulsory.
- A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subject/papers and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/She will appear in the subject/papers in which he/she got the compartment. He/She will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage), available to him/her to clear his/her compartment in subjects/papers. He/she will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her courses within five years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course.
- **A candidate failing in three or more subjects /papers will be treated as FAIL in that year and has to repeat the entire year.**

- The successful candidates will be classified on the combined results of Part–I, II & III Examinations as per the following parameters :  
First Division: 60% marks or more in the Aggregate  
Second Division: 50% marks but less than 60%  
Third Division: Less than 50% marks in the Aggregate.
- **Re-evaluation** :Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HP University Ordinance for the Annual System.
- The students shall be required to complete the degree within five years.
- Final/Annual Examinations shall be held in the month of March/April every year and the Supplementary Examinations shall be held in the month of September/October every year.

### Important Guidelines/Pattern/Scheme of Papers for B.A.III

- The Students seeking roll-on admission to B.A.III Year will have to study **Two DSE Subjects**, i.e., **DSE-I and DSE-II (Discipline Specific Electives)**, based on their two DSC subjects. Whereby the two DSC Subjects opted by the students at the time of their admission to the B.A. Course in the first year will continue to remain the two DSE Subjects for them in the final year.
- The **Students of III year** will also continue to study **two SEC Course** that they had initiated from B.A.II year of their course onwards.
- In addition to the aforementioned three subjects the students will study two paper of **Generic Elective GE-I and GE-II**.

**Note :** (Generic Elective Course) **The Generic Elective in the final year required to be offered by the student will be other than the two Discipline Specific Courses offered by the student.**

**Migration:** Inter-institutional Migration (either from one college to another or from a college to ICDEOL and vice- versa) of students will be allowed as per HPU norms and will accrue only after obtaining **No-Objection Certificate from both the Relieving and Receiving Institutions.**

**Re-Appear (2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Year):** If a student, who fulfils all the requirements for appearing in a Yearly examination, is unable to appear in the examination or to complete it on account of his/her own serious illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (Mother, Father, Brother and Sister), or due to the clash of dates of State or National level examinations falls on dates of the semester exams may be allowed to appear in the Yearly exam in the next Academic Year when examination for that year is due. Permission to sit in the examination will be granted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the names of the students to the Registration and Migration Cell for information.

#### Eligibility Criteria and Conditions:

- AGE:** A candidate should not be more than 23 years of age (for Boys) and not of more than 25 years of age (for Girls) as on **01 July, 2026**. However, for SC/ ST candidates a relaxation of three years in age is allowed.
- The Vice-Chancellor of H.P.U. may in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for the approval of the Vice- Chancellor, HP University Shimla for every academic year.
- Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to.

### **Admission Procedure:**

**STEP-I:** Every candidate seeking admission shall apply for admission on the prescribed Admission Form that is available in the college prospectus. The Admission Form should be filled legibly by each candidate in his or her own handwriting.

**STEP-II :** A candidate seeking admission should personally appear before the concerned Admission Committee along with the required original and certified documents and he/she must also be accompanied by Parents/Guardian at the time of admission.

**STEP-III :** After the approval of the Admission Form by the Admission Committee it would be forwarded to the Scrutiny Committee and finally the admission to the college would be granted on merit- basis and on the recommendation of the Principal. The Principal, however, reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.

**STEP-IV :** If the admission of the candidate is approved / recommended by the Principal, the candidate shall have to deposit the fee/ dues as per the instructions displayed on the college notice board. The number of seats is maximum 80 in each DSC subject and these seats will be filled on the **Basis of Merit** in each of the DSC subjects respectively. The students are advised to deposit their fee and funds within time after consulting the merit list that would be displayed on the college notice board.

**STEP-V:** After depositing the fee the candidate will seek the enrolment of the college as a regular student. The admission will however remain **PURELY PROVISIONAL** in nature unless it is approved by HP University.

### **Documents Required for Admission:**

The candidates must submit/produce the following documents along with legibly and completely filled up Admission Form:

- i. Original Certificates (along with their photocopies) Matric onwards.
- ii. Three passport size photographs.
- iii. Original Character Certificate issued by the institution last attended (for new admissions /fresh candidates only)
- iv. An Affidavit issued by a Competent Authority in case of gap.
- v. Category Certificate for SC/ST/Specially Abled students.
- vi. Sports and Cultural Certificates (if seeking admission under the Sports/ Cultural Quota).
- vii. Board equivalence Certificate for the candidates who have passed 10+2 from other Board/University than the H.P.Board. (HPBOSE). All such candidates (except H.P.Board candidates) will also have to produce original Migration Certificate from Board/ University from which they have passed the previous (last) examination.
- viii. Private students seeking admission to the College for the first time should submit recent Character Certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer/ MLA/ Pradhan of M.C./ Panchayat. (which shall be valid for six months)
- ix. Certificate of Bonafide Himachali (For girls students who belong to Himachal). Only girl students who are Bonafide Himachali are eligible for exemption of tuition fees.
- x. Copy of the Aadhar Card.
- xi. Copy of the Pass Book of Bank Account.

**Note:** Submission of false information of any kind for the purpose of admission is a serious offence. Any such act will be viewed seriously and penal proceedings can be initiated against such candidates/ such offenders. The admission of such candidates shall also stand cancelled instantaneously.

**Reservation of Seats:** Admission to UG courses shall be open to all persons irrespective of race, creed, caste or class subject to the conditions laid down in the Roster issued/notified by the H.P.U.

**Point-1** The candidates seeking admission under any category or quota mentioned in the Roster, i.e., SC, ST, Specially abled, Sports or cultural, will have to produce the original certificate, issued by a Competent Authority, of his/ her category or quota at the time of admission to get the benefit of reservation.

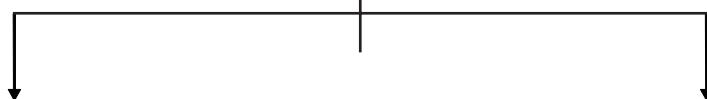

### STUDENT EVALUATION SYSTEM (for B.A./B.Com 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year)

#### UNDER-CBCS-UGC-(RUSA)-Annual System ( 2026-27) :

The Student Evaluation System under CBCS of RUSA (Annual System) has been divided into two components:



Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)  
(30 Marks: For all courses)

Annual/Final Examination

(70 Marks: For all courses)

#### Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):

It includes : (i) **Class Room Attendance** (05 Marks): A student must attend a minimum of 75% lectures/ tutorials failing which he/ she will not be eligible for appearing in the End Semester Examination of HPU

(ii) **Mid Term Test** (MTT) and a **Class Test** [10+05 = 15 Marks]

Mid –Term Test will be of 10 marks and the Class Test will be of 05 Marks for the students (in each Academic Year)

(iii) **Seminars/ Assignments/ Presentation/Tests and Tutorials** (10 Marks)

The above mentioned activities will be conducted by the teachers on regular basis during the Academic Year and the students will be awarded/grade according to their performance in these class-room activities.

## ANNUAL EXAMINATION: (70 MARKS)

It refers to the examination conducted by the HPU at the end of the Academic Year. The Annual Examination will be based on the whole syllabus and will be of 03 hour duration.

**NOTE :** (i) *Only those students will be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination who have pass marks in CCA.*

(ii) *HPU may from time to time revise and amend (change) the regulations and curriculum after due approval of different bodies and authorities of the HP University.*

### GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS:

(i) *Change of Subject :* The students/ applicants are advised to be very careful while selecting and filling their DSC subjects and SEC subjects. These subjects once opted will not be changed under any circumstances. The DSC-1 subject opted by the student at the time of admission in the first year will remain his/her SEC subject from 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

(ii) *Re-Admission :* The name of the student who remains absent from any class for 10 continuous days, without proper leave, shall be struck-off from the college- rolls. However, the Principal, in his/her discretion, may re- admit such student on payment of the re-admission fee along with fine. The re- admission should be taken within four days of the name being struck- off failing which he/she will not be eligible for admission. Any student whose name is struck- off for the second time in a session will not be eligible for re-admission except in exceptional circumstances.

(iii) *Leave Rules :* Students applying for leave shall get their application recommended /approved from the concerned Subject Teacher. Leave up to a period of 6 days will be sanctioned by the concerned Teacher and leave for more than 6 days will be sanctioned by the Principal. Absence without leave would entail absence fine at the following rates:

- (a) Absence per Period = Rupee 1/period
- (b) Absence from MTT-I/MTT-II exams = Rs.50/ paper

(iv) **Notice Board and Identity Card:** Every student is advised to carry his/her college identity card while coming to the institution. It is also advisable to read the notices pasted/affixed on the college Notice Board on regular basis to keep upto date information about the college activities.

(v) *Discipline:* Discipline is the key of student life and the institution expects high standards of orderliness from its pupil/subjects. The following activities will be considered as violation of the college discipline and may result in fine, expulsion or rustication, depending on the gravity of the offence:

- (I) Indulging in acts of Ragging and Eve - teasing.
- (II) Making noise, disturbing classes and using mobiles within the college campus.
- (III) Damaging college furniture/ property and writing on walls, furniture and blackboards.
- (IV) Bringing outsiders to the college campus without any justifiable cause.
- (V) Any student found smoking or consuming other tobacco products in the college premises will be dealt sternly with.

**Note:** *A student found guilty of misconduct shall not be eligible for prizes, scholarships, fee- concession or membership of the CSCA (College Student Central Association), Sports Council or other important bodies of the College.*

**PARENT- TEACHER ASSOCIATION (The PTA Body):**

Since 2014, the college has framed a PTA for co-ordinated efforts of Parents and College Administration and for the betterment of the institution thereof. Fresh PTA will be constituted in the month of August 2021 as per the PTA norms laid down by the Education Department of H.P. Government. The Annual PTA fee for the session 2023-24 shall finally be decided after by PTA General House.
